

Night Rating

Make the most of that hard earned license ... do it in the dark!!! Now is the time to free yourself of those restricting daylight hours.

The night rating provides a new dimension to your flying by introducing some of the basic techniques involved in instrument flying.

This advancement of your flying skills will enable you to extend your flights and fly in a beautiful and relaxing atmosphere.

Admission Requirements

1. Canadian Private Pilot License

Skill:

1. An applicant for a night rating shall have reached the level of skill specified in the Flight Instructor Standard.

Course Outline:

Minimum 20 hours flight time:

- 1. 10 hours of night flight time including a minimum of:
 - a. 5 hours dual flight time including 2 hours cross-country
 - b. 5 hours solo flight time including 10 takeoffs, circuits, and landings
- 10 hours of dual instrument time which may include the 5 hours instrument obtained during the Private Pilot Course.

NOTE: Prices quoted are for Transport Canada minimums and do not include any additional training which may be required for preflight and postflight briefing costs.

Other Information:

- The Course cost instrument time assumes the candidate has previously acquired 5 hours instrument flying during the Private Pilot course otherwise up to an additional 5 hours of instrument flying will be required (\$1,450.00)
- Prices are based on the Transport Canada minimums and do not include taxes when applicable.
- Up to 5 hours of the 10 hours instrument time may be completed in the RedBird simulator.
